ELEMENTS OF A CANADA/MANITOBA IMMIGRATION PROTOCOL

- 1. Total annual immigration target for Manitoba 10,000
- 2. Build on structure, experience and principles of the existing Provincial Nominee Program.
- 3. The existing immigration programs operated by Canada all remain in place. The Manitoba agreement is supplemental.
- 4. Create new "Canada-Manitoba Immigration Agreement" (Agreement) that permits a new program to be operated by Manitoba under agreed principles and conditions.
- 5. The 'Agreement' will permit Manitoba to select and approve immigrants. Canada will limit its role to health and security plus the facilitation of documents.
- 6. The 'Agreement' will presume certain performance standards for immigrants under this program. These standards may include:
 - No or minimal participation in welfare or similar support
 - A strong record of employment participation after immigration
 - An agreed level of retention in Manitoba or an agreed region
- 7. Canada will permit conditional immigration where a period of residence is a contractual obligation and can be enforced.
- 8. Manitoba is free to create structures or agencies to implement the program.
- 9. Manitoba may apply a fee for service to prospective immigrants under the 'Agreement'. Manitoba is also free to refund charges or in other ways provide subsidies to prospective immigrants.
- 10. Additional supplementary Agreements may be created to facilitate opportunity for special categories such as students or other identifiable groups.
